WHEREAS, Robert Swartz, Chief Engineer of the Water Authority of Western Nassau County (hereinafter "Water Authority"), provided a written report to the Board of Directors informing the Board that the Volatile Organic Compounds (hereinafter "VOCs") in Well No. 15B are rising indicating the necessity of an immediate carbon exchange; and

WHEREAS, the aforesaid written report further indicates that an emergency carbon exchange is necessary in order to keep Well No. 15B in service and reduce the VOCs to prevent a rise above the maximum contaminant level resulting in loss of use of said well; and

WHEREAS, the aforesaid written report recommends engaging the services of Siemens Industry Inc. to perform the emergency repair in accordance with its proposal of sixty-three thousand two hundred sixty (\$63,260.00) dollars;

NOW THEREFORE, upon motion of G. Bakich, seconded by S. Powderly,

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Directors of the Water Authority hereby authorize the performance of the emergency carbon exchange by Siemens Industry Inc. in accordance with its proposal of sixty-three thousand two hundred sixty (\$63,260.00) dollars, and be it
